

Edward J. Kilduff, Jr. January 12, 1932 - May 28, 2014

Edward J. Kilduff Jr., 82, of New Britain, widower of Nancy Place Kilduff, passed away Wednesday May 28, 2014 at the UConn Health Center after a short illness. A New Britain native, son of the late Edward Kilduff Sr. and Beatrice Leake Kilduff, he was a lifelong New Britain resident and also cherished his second home in Athens, Maine. He attended New Britain High School and was a US Army Veteran of the Korean Conflict. Ed retired from the New Britain Police Department as a Captain in 1979 after 28 years and later was a project supervisor for Tilcon-Tomasso until 1988. Ed was a parishioner of St. Francis of Assisi Church; and was a member of the 169th Infantry Group; the New Britain Elk's Lodge 957 and the New Britain American Legion Post 6.
