



## Frances Vail Russell

March 19, 1932 - June 18, 2016

Frances Vail Russell, of New Britain, widow of David Dickinson Russell, Jr., passed away unexpectedly, Saturday June 18, 2016 at the Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. Born in Hartford, Fran graduated from Oxford School, the Wheelock College in Boston and received her Masters in Early Education from CCSU. She has lived in New Britain since 1955. Mrs. Russell lovingly taught Kindergarten at Lincoln School for many years before her retirement. Since retirement, she was active at First Church of Christ, Congregational in New Britain; the YWCA, HOCC – New Britain General, and was a former President of the Auxiliary, also serving as a hospital corporator. She volunteered at the information desk, directing families from far and wide. She was active in the NBMAA, Art League of New Britain, New Britain Symphony, Art for the Cure, Race for the Cure, and Corporator of the Klingberg Family Center. She was a former Board Member of the Junior League of Greater New Britain.

Surviving are three daughters, Linda Sniadack of Kensington; Ann Dilling and her husband Steven of New Britain; and Elizabeth Sibicky and her husband Charles of Griswold; a sister, Hazel B. Vail of West Hartford; and seven grandchildren, Christine and William Sniadack, Joseph, Thomas and James Dilling, and David Sibicky and his wife Brandy, and Christopher Sibicky and his wife Stephanie.

Funeral services will be held Friday 10 AM at First Church of Christ Congregational, 830 Corbin Avenue, New Britain. Burial will be private and at the convenience of the family. Calling hours will be held Thursday 5 to 7 PM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain.
