



Albert E. Moseley

September 6, 1924 - February 9, 2005

Albert E. Moseley, Jr., 80, of Berlin died Wednesday February 9, 2005 at New Britain General Hospital after a short illness. Born in Garrattsville, NY, the son of the late Albert E. and Ernestine Britney Moseley, the family later moved to Farmington, Unionville, and Berlin, CT. Mr. Moseley joined the U.S. Navy early in World War II and served in the Atlantic and European Theaters on board a destroyer escort mostly on convoy duty. After the war he returned to New Britain, later living in Newington and Berlin. He was employed by the New Britain Post Office, retiring as supervisor. He was a member of the New Britain First Church of Christ, Congregational and active in the New Britain Elks, a life member of the VFW and a founder of the Connecticut Destroyer Sailors Association and a member of the National Destroyer Escort Association, of which he was currently State Skipper, attending their national convention almost every year.

He is survived by two sons, Albert and his wife Barbara of Hooksett, NH and their children Shawn, Kyle, Samantha, and 2nd lieutenant Jason and John of Carson City, NV; two sisters and their husbands, Margaret and Frank Russell of East Hartford and Ernestine and Frank Fraprie of New Britain; his very dear friend and longtime companion, Louise Faipler, of Berlin and her beloved family including, Tom Faipler, Fred and Cara Faipler and their children Jack and Danielle, Brenda and Mark Pearson, Terry Faipler and his children TJ, Jessie; his first wife, Doris Moseley of Carson City, NV and his second wife Patricia Jacobson of Sharon, NH. He was predeceased by a daughter,

Maryann and two brothers Richard and John Moseley.
