December 21, 1922 - February 20, 2005

Aldo Vitelli, 82, of New Britain, husband of Doris Bussiere Vitelli, died unexpectedly Sunday February 20, 2005 at Bradley Memorial Hospital in Southington. Born in Villerupt, France, son of the late Vincent and Enrica Vitelli, he lived in New Britain most of his life. Aldo served in the National Guard during and after WWII and was employed at Fafnir Bearing Company for 40 years, retiring in 1980. He was a member of St. Ann's Church; the New Britain YMCA; the 169th Infantry Veteran's Association; and the Hardware City Stamp Club.

Besides Doris, his wife of 58 years, Aldo leaves a son Keith Vitelli and his wife Susan of New Britain; a daughter, Linda Stone and her husband Paul of Hampton Falls, NH; two sisters, Theresa Ingriselli and her husband Ralph of Southington; and Olga Agostini and her husband Peter of New Britain; a sister-in-law, Joan Poirier of Ft. Lauderdale, FL; three grandchildren, Amy Galvin and her husband Eric of Southington; Megan Carlson and her husband James of Farmington; and Zachary Stone of Exeter, NH. Aldo's greatest accomplishment was his great-granddaughter Abigail Galvin. He also leaves several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services are Wednesday 8:45 AM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain followed by a Mass of Christian Burial 9:30 AM at St. Ann's Church.
