Ann Bohatzuk Harris, 85, of New Britain, wife of Bernard Harris, passed away Wednesday June 12, 2013 at her home. A lifelong New Britain resident, she was a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1946 and from New Britain General Hospital School of Nursing in 1948. Ann later received her BS and Masters Degrees in Education from CCSC. She worked for 16 years in Labor & Delivery at New Britain General Hospital and later was a Nurse Educator at St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing in Waterbury for 17 years, retiring in 1993. Ann was a member of St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in New Britain and served as head of the cemetery committee; was active in the St. Olga Sisterhood as well as several other church groups.
