Anthony Tarro, 91, of Plainville, husband of Olga Elia Tarro, passed away Wednesday October 17, 2012 at Brittany Farms Health Center in New Britain. Born in Providence, RI, son of the late Joseph and Rachel Leone Tarro, he was a former New Britain resident, moving to Plainville in 1982. A World War II Army Air Corps veteran, he served in the China/Burma theaters of operation with the "Fighting Tigers" and was assigned to the 341st Bombardment Group / HQ 14th A.A.F as a bombardier on B-24's and flew many combat missions. He was employed at Emhart Corporation in Windsor for over 20 years, retiring in 1981. Tony was a member of St. John the Evangelist Church in New Britain and was an avid golfer and member of The Men's Club at Stanley Golf Course.
