Arthur Yeterian, 91, of New Britain, husband of Mary Harutunian Yeterian, passed away Sunday January 6, 2008 at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. A lifelong New Britain resident and graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1932, he attended Teacher College of Connecticut now CCSU and was a World War II US Army veteran. Art was employed at Fafnir Bearing Company for 42 years, retiring in 1978. He was a member of the First Church of Christ, Congregational in New Britain. An avid sports fan, he loved bowling and playing golf and was known in the Central Connecticut area for being a baseball umpire and basketball referee.
