



## Bernard Rudolph Harris Jr.

November 18, 1923 - May 20, 2015

Bernard Rudolph Harris, Jr., 91, of New Britain, widower of Ann Bohatzuk Harris, passed away Wednesday May 20 at Jerome Home. He was born in Fairport, Virginia and was the eldest son of Bernard R. Harris Sr. and Geodice Bowen Harris. He spent most of his adult life in New Britain and served as alderman under Mayor Bill McNamara. Bernard served in the Merchant Marines from 1941 to 1949 as a seaman

and also as a submariner in the US Navy during the Korean Conflict. Bernard graduated from Teacher's College of Connecticut with a BS degree and the University of Hartford with a Masters of Education. He furthered his education with an Advanced Graduate Study Degree in Guidance Counseling. He taught English and History at both Pulaski High and New Britain High schools retiring as a guidance counselor in 1984. Bernard was a member of numerous organizations including VFW, American Legion, New Britain Federation of Teachers, Moose and Disabled

American Veterans. He enjoyed fishing, boating, gardening, traveling and loved his homes in Old Saybrook and Port Charlotte, Florida.

Surviving are two daughters, Lynn Disney and her husband Thomas and Deborah Janowski, all of New Britain; a sister, Leah Rae Clark of Baltimore, Maryland; four grandchildren, Thomas Janowski and

his wife Wendy; Alicia Janowski; Amanda Disney and her husband Richard Field; and Matthew Disney and his wife Ashley; 5 great grandchildren, Tristan, Christopher, Alexander, Emma and Devin. Besides his wife Ann, he was predeceased by a daughter, Cindy Murren.
