Bertrand Thompson, Jr., 85, of Plainville, husband of Helen Polaski Thompson, passed away Monday February 25, 2008 at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. Born in Mount Vernon, NY, he was a former New Britain resident, moving to Plainville in 1951. A graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1941, he was a World War II US Navy veteran.
