Betty Aglio a loving mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother, passed away peacefully on Saturday, May 24, 2025 in her home at the age of 95. A native and lifelong New Britain resident, Betty is a graduate of New Britain High School, class of 1946 and the Willimantic School of Nursing. She worked as a nurse at the former Newington Children's Hospital before taking time off to raise her children and support the family business.
