“ To the Nygren Family - I was sorry to read Betty Jane's obituary in the Hartford Courant and wanted to express my sympathy. Betty Jane was my first (and only) beloved babysitter when I was growing up on Vega Street in New Britain in the 1940s and 1950s. My parents, Duncan and Jessie Coghill chose wisely when they had Betty Jane serve as my occasional babysitter. My mother often said that she thought that I loved Betty Jane and I think I really did when I was a young lad. It wasn't often that my parents left me in Betty Jane's care, but all sorts of memories flooded my mind when I read of her passing in the paper. I also was very fond of Linnea and Carl Holmberg, your grandparents, and remember hearing that Linnea played the piano in my in-laws' home in Kensington after attending our wedding in 1964 when people gathered there after our wedding reception at First Church on Corbin Avenue. Vega Street/Ash Street were what my mother used to call "The League of Nations" as there were all sorts of nationalities represented on those two streets and it was a safe place to grow up and I have fond memories of my early years. My brother, Henry, is now 88 and I turned 75 this past September - much time has passed, but good memories endure.
