March 5, 1946 - April 17, 2018

Bogdan “Bob” Moch, 72, of New Britain, husband of Theresa (Mattingly) Moch, passed away Tuesday (April 17, 2018) at the Hospital of Central CT. Born in Germany, Bob has been a New Britain resident since 1960. A New Britain High School graduate, Class of 1964, Bob received an accounting degree from the University of Hartford in 1970.
