Brian R. Evans, 60, of New Britain, husband of Roberta (Ruel) Evans, passed away Tuesday (December 22, 2020) at Yale New Haven Hospital. Prior to a knee replacement, Brian was working at Advanced Auto in New Britain for 5 years. He was Past Master of Unity Lodge 148, AF&AM in New Britain, where he held that position twice. He was also a member of New Britain Elks Lodge 957. He was active in city politics as a former elected official serving on the Board of Tax Review and Constable. He was a former EMT with the New Britain Civil Defense Rescue Squad. He was also a former New Britain Auxiliary Police Officer. Brian enjoyed watching the Miami Dolphins, racing, the history channel, listening to music, playing the drums, motorcycles, and hanging out with his dog Annie and his cat Bailey. He went through so many difficult medical situations always with a positive attitude. A kind friend, who was always interested in how you were doing and always willing to help. 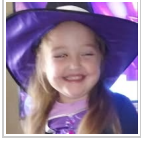

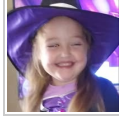
