Captain Philip Larson, 76, of Berlin, husband of Linda (D'Amato) Larson, passed away Wednesday (May 26, 2021) at home surrounded by his family. Born in New Britain, Phil has been a lifelong Berlin resident and was employed by Balf Trucking of Newington for over 25 years. As a devoted grandfather he never shined more than when he was spending time with his grandchildren, from watching Kendall at her dance recitals to cheering Koop on at football and baseball games, and teaching him how to fish.
