I remember how skilled she was at working with customers who had special medical needs, and how she knew the inventory of almost every medical supply company by heart. She was extraordinarily talented, putting customers with these special needs at ease and was so competent they couldn't help but to trust her. In the small community of Moodus, CT, where the pharmacy not only serves the medical needs of the community, but acts more as a general store, she was the supplier of medical devices, household appliances and more importantly dependability to the surrounding area. I will greatly miss her stubbornness a Bergstrom family trait I'm afraid, her love of good food and her smile.
