



Carl Norman Holmberg

June 12, 1923 - June 29, 2010

Carl Norman "Norm" Holmberg, 87, of Kensington, husband of Mabel Bostrom Holmberg, died Tuesday June 29, 2010 at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. A New Britain native, son of the late Carl and Linnea Johnson Holmberg, he graduated from New Britain High School in 1941 and entered the University of Connecticut. He served with the US Army during WWII in the European theater and was a recipient of the Purple Heart and Bronze Star. Norm returned to the University of Connecticut after the war, was a member of the Sigma Chi Fraternity and the UConn baseball team, graduating in 1948. He was employed as an engineer at Marlin Rockwell/TRW in Plainville for 30 years and then was an assistant to the Commissioner of Buildings and Grounds for the State of Connecticut for ten years, retiring in 1993. He was a member of First Lutheran Church of the Reformation in New Britain, was an avid golfer and a member of the Timberlin Mens Club and the SVEA Social Club.

Besides his wife of 56 years, Norman is survived by a daughter, Nancy Robertson and her husband Alan of New Britain; a sister, Betty Jane Nygren of New Britain; 3 grandchildren, Matthew Robertson and his wife Jesse of Portland, ME; Erica Robertson of Lynnfield, MA; and Adam Robertson of New Britain; several cousins, nieces and nephews.

A funeral service for Norman will be held 10 AM Saturday July 3, 2010 at the

First Lutheran Church, 77 Franklin Square, New Britain, CT 06051 followed by burial with military honors in Fairview Cemetery.
