May 2, 1918 - December 7, 2002

Carl Leonard Jorson, 84, of New Britain, husband of the late Alice Nelson Jorson, died Saturday December 7, 2002 At Southington Care. Born in New Britain, Mr. Jorson graduated from New Britain High School with the Class of 1937. He is a World War II U.S. Army veteran. Carl was employed at Kalart in Plainville until his retirement after 30 years in 1980. Carl was a member of Kensington Baptist Church; was a former Sunday School treasurer and trustee; was an avid camper; a member of the former Walnut Hill Lodge #139 AF&AM, now Unity Lodge; was a member of the Scottish Rite, Valley of Norwich; served on the advisory board of New Britain Assembly #6 Rainbow Order of Girls; Grand Cross of Color, Connecticut State Rainbow; was "Mason of the year" for Walnut Hill Lodge in 1979; and received the Service to Youth Award from the CT Grand Lodge in 1982.

Mr. Jorson is survived by a son Richard C. Jorson and his wife Linda of Canton; a daughter Lynn E. Jorson of New Britain; several nieces and nephews including his favorite niece Lois Johnson of New Britain. Besides his wife Alice, Carl was predeceased by a brother Lambert Ljor and a sister Mildred Johnson.
