Carol Kozikowski Skinner, 59, of Kensington, passed away Wednesday Sept 10, 2008 at Hospital of Central CT in New Britain surrounded by her family. A New Britain native, daughter of the late Bernard and Anne Filipek Kozikowski, she moved to Berlin in 1968. A graduate of St. Thomas Aquinas High School in New Britain, Class of 1967, she attended Central CT State University. Carol was a Unit Secretary at New Britain General Hospital for 20 years and later worked at Klingberg Family Centers for 8 years. Carol was a member of St. Paul's Church in Kensington; the Kensington Garden Club; the Holy Cross Drum Corps; and was a member and past president of the Kensington Mothers Club. Carol will be remembered for her cake decorating, her creativity, her love of music and her involvement in the community.
