Carolyn Stange Magnuson, 81, of Southington, wife of Russell E. Magnuson, passed away Saturday December 26, 2009 at the Hospital of Central CT in Southington. Born in Warwick, Mass, daughter of the late Carl and Georgie Bailey Stange, she is a graduate of Orange High School in Orange, Mass in 1946 and attended the Moody Secretarial School in New Britain. Carolyn was a former New Britain resident moving to Southington in 1957. She was employed at the former American Hardware and then for Dr. Sidney Eisenberg in New Britain as a Medical Technician until 1957. Carolyn was a member of First Lutheran Church in New Britain; was the Choir Godmother; was active with the Southington Girl Scout & Cub Scouts; the Southington Grange Fair; and was a member and volunteer at the New England Air Museum in Windsor Locks.
