Charles A. Boyce, 88, of Plantsville, died Sunday October 24, 2004 at Andrews Health Center in New Britain. His wife of 52 years, Evelyn Oliver Boyce predeceased him in 1993. Born in Waterbury, he was a New Britain resident for over 50 years, moving to Plainville in 1990. A graduate of Plainville High School, Class of 1935, he was a World War II U.S. Army veteran.
