C. Robert "Bob" Hoffmann Jr., 92, of Kensington, husband of Mildred Garbar Hoffmann, passed away Wednesday December 10, 2014 at the Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. A New Britain native and former resident, he was son of the late Charles R. Hoffmann Sr. and Viola Zoeller Hoffmann, and lived in Kensington since 1965. A graduate of New Britain High School, January Class of 1942, he was a World War II US Navy Veteran. Bob worked at his family Bakery Hoffmann's Bakery for over 30 years and later was head Baker at Loomis-Chaffe School in Windsor for 12 years, retiring in 1986. He was a member of St. Johns Lutheran Church in New Britain and the Berlin VFW Post.

Besides "Millie", his wife of 70 years, he leaves two daughters, Susan Hoffmann and Gail Benson and her husband Dick, all of Berlin; a granddaughter, Lindsay Benson of Berlin; a great grandson, Dylan; a sister-in-law, Carole Hoffmann of Berlin; three nieces and a nephew.
