Charles "Chuck" N. Reluga, 87, of Niantic, husband of Ruth (Holt) Reluga, passed away Friday, August 16 at Beechwood Long Term Care Center in New London.

Born in New Britain, son of the late Mikolaj and Melania (Mazur) Reluga, he lived in

Newington before moving to Niantic. Chuck was a graduate of New Britain High

School, UCONN, and received his Master's from CCSU. He taught biology at Plainville High School for 34 years, retiring in 1998. He was a member of the CT Fly Fisherman's Association, served on the Attawan Beach Board of Governors,

and the East Lyme Conservation and Inland Wetlands Commissions.

Chuck loved to say he was descended from a long line of Polish boat builders, building four wooden canoes and a Swampscott dory in his basement. He was an

avid fly fisherman and had a deep curiosity for the natural world that he shared

with all who knew him. His kindness, generosity, and good humor will be missed.

Besides his loving wife Ruth of 53 years, he leaves his son Timothy (Jessica Conway), daughter Elizabeth (Andrew Canellos) and three grandchildren, Arthur

and Benjamin Reluga, and Evelyn Canellos. He is also survived by his sister, Lucille Reluga of New Britain and niece Kathryn Reluga of Easton. Chuck was predeceased by his parents, brother Henry Reluga and his wife Marie, sister Lillian Reluga, and nephew Eryc Reluga. Chuck's family expresses sincere thanks
