



Charles E. Strohmenger

Charles E. Strohmenger, 86, of Avery Heights, Hartford, widower of Frances Burke Strohmenger, passed away Thursday October 23, 2008 at Hartford Hospital. Born in Brooklyn, NY, he lived in Rockaway Beach, Queens, NY before moving to West Hartford in 2002 and to Avery Heights in 2004. A World War II US Army veteran, he served with the Third Army in Europe and received the American Service Medal, The Good Conduct Medal and the World War II Victory Medal. He was a fireman in the New York City Fire Department for 29 years, retiring in 1975. Charles was a member of the VFW and the Knights of Columbus in Rockaway Beach.

Surviving is his son, Thomas Strohmenger and his wife Kathy of West Hartford; two grandchildren, Heather Bushnell and her husband Brett of West Hartford; and Jason Vaitukaitis and his wife Andrea of Rowayton, CT; two great grandsons, Ryan and Matthew Bushnell; a niece and three nephews. Besides his wife Frances, he was predeceased by a brother, Frederick Strohmenger.
