



Constantine "Gus" Demady

May 30, 1933 - March 20, 2018

Constantine B. "Gus" Demady, 84, of Berlin, husband of Elizabeth "Betty" (Tragakiss) Demady, passed away Tuesday (March 20, 2018) at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Born in Meriden, he was a former New Britain resident, moving to Berlin 3 years ago. A graduate of Meriden High School, Class of 1951, Gus received a Bachelor's Degree from Teachers College of CT (now CCSU) and was a peacetime veteran of the US Army. After his retirement, he was involved in tutoring and educational services. An active member of St. George Greek Orthodox Church in New Britain, he sang in the church choir as well as the Saint Barbara's Choir in Orange, CT.

Besides his wife Betty, he leaves a son, Damon Demady and his wife Holly of Swampscott, Mass; a daughter, Despina "Desa" Kittleman and her husband Charles of Kensington; a sister, Mary Georgas of Clearwater, FL; and beloved Papou of six grandchildren, Alena, Olivia, Samantha, Elizabeth, Katherine and James as well as several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services are Monday 11 AM at St. George Greek Orthodox Church, 301 West Main Street, New Britain. With a reception immediately following in the church hall.
