David P. Foberg, 67, of Plainville, died Saturday July 3, 2004 at his home. Born in New Britain, son of the late Arvid and Florence P. Madigan Foberg, he lived in New Britain until moving to Plainville in 1974. A graduate of New Britain High School, class of 1954, he graduate from the Teachers College of Connecticut now CCSU and received a Masters Degree from the University of Hartford in Education. David was employed in the New Britain School System from 1960 to 1993 as a Math Teacher at Holmes Elementary, Nathan Hale, and Slade Middle School with the last five years as PPT Coordinator for secondary students as a certified guidance counselor. He was a past president for the New Britain Federation of Teachers. David was a member of First Lutheran Church in New Britain; a member of the church council; the adult choir; and served as cook for First Lutheran Church and assisted at the summer day camp, Lenten Luncheons, and other church functions. David also worked at Camp Schade New Britain Fresh Air Camp for twenty years, serving the last three as Camp Director. He was a former member of the Connecticut Gay Mens Chorus in New Haven.

Surviving is a brother, Donald H. Foberg and his wife Dale of Glastonbury; Included in his family is Barbara Griffin of Ridgefield; several nieces and nephews; and three cousins. He was predeceased by a sister Dorothy Griffin in 1958.

A memorial service will be held Friday July 9, 2004 11 AM at First Lutheran Church, 77 Franklin Square, New Britain, CT 06051. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery at the convenience of the family.
