



Debra Caswell

January 5, 1951 - April 23, 2023

Debra J. (Erickson) Caswell, 72, of Fremont, NH, widow of Walter W. Caswell, Jr., passed away unexpectedly Sunday (April 23, 2023) at her home. She was born in New Britain to the late Arthur and Jane (Hulsizer) Erickson. She was a longtime Kensington resident before moving to New Hampshire in 2020 to be closer to her children.

Debra graduated from New Britain High School in 1968 and received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees from CCSU. A lifelong educator, she was an English teacher at McGee Middle School in Berlin until her retirement.

Previously she had taught at Plainville High School and CCSU. She was also a former part-time secretary at First Lutheran Church in New Britain.

Throughout her life she was active with several local theater groups, including the New Britain Repertory Theatre and the Oddfellows Playhouse in Middletown. She also directed a number of student productions at Plainville High School and McGee Middle School. Deb loved helping others, and in her retirement, she was an active volunteer with several local charities and community organizations.

Surviving is her daughter Emily Caswell and her husband Justin Alix of Exeter, NH; her son William "Will" Caswell, his wife Cait and their son Owen of Nashua, NH; a sister-in-law, Julie (Furs) Erickson of Kensington; a brother- and sister-in-law, John and Deborah Catalano of Berlin; and several aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews and cousins. Besides her husband Walter, she was predeceased by a brother, David Erickson, and a sister, Nancy Sharpe.
