



## Dino P. Muratori

June 29, 1923 - February 12, 2011

Dino P. Muratori, 87, of New Britain, husband of Kathleen Romano Muratori for 64 years, passed away unexpectedly Saturday February 12, 2011 at the Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. A lifelong New Britain resident, he graduated from New Britain High School, Class of 1941, and served with the US Army during World War II in the South Pacific including the battle of Iwo Jima. Dino was employed in Facility Maintenance at Central CT State University for 13 years, retiring in 1984. He was a member of St. Ann's Church in New Britain; the Iwo Jima Survivor's Association; and was a former member of the New Britain Democratic Town Committee in addition to serving in various elected positions.

Besides his wife Kathleen, he leaves two sons, Albert Muratori and his wife Ruth of New Britain; and Dean Muratori and his wife Anne, also of New Britain; a daughter, Nancy Moran and her husband Richard Ladizki, of Berlin; a sister, Lydia Poeta of New Britain; six grandchildren, Karen Petersen and her husband Tron of Newington; Matt Moran and his wife Rebecca of Bloomfield; James Moran and his fiancée Winnie Cheng of Simsbury; Stefan Muratori, Kathleen and Gina Muratori, all of New Britain; a great granddaughter, Willow Petersen; several nieces and nephews. Dino was predeceased by two brothers, Joseph "Ruggy" Muratori and Albert Muratori; and a sister, Mary Garbellini.

Funeral services are Thursday 9:15 AM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain, followed by a Mass of Christian Burial 10 AM at St. Ann's Church, 101 North Street, New Britain, CT 06051.
