Donald J. Scagliola Sr., 80, of New Britain, passed away Friday, February 18, 2011 at the Jefferson House in Newington, following a yearlong struggle with pancreatic cancer. Donald leaves behind his wife, Hanna Bocian Scagliola, to whom he was married for 35 years. A lifelong New Britain resident, he was son of the late Alfred and Gladys Coe Scagliola. A graduate of New Britain High School in 1949, Don established and operated Don's Rug Service which was his true work passion. He also worked at New Britain General Hospital, and for the Berlin school system at Willard School and Berlin High School. Following his retirement, he kept busy by driving for Pep Boys. His best memories were of his summers and off-seasons spent at the beaches of Old Lyme with his best friends Angelo deceased and Corinne Pinto. He loved to dance and cook, visiting Cape Cod, Maine, and Myrtle Beach, and taking cruises. He was affiliated with St. Mark's Episcopal Church in New Britain. Besides his wife Hanna, Don leaves his sons, Gerard "Skip" Scagliola and his wife Dottie; Retired US Air Force Lt. Col. David Scagliola, and his wife Maria; Donald Scagliola Jr.; Robin Scagliola; and Christopher Zduniak; daughters, Donna Lee Wolicki; Dale Kirsh; and Beata Liss and her husband Paul; brothers, Harold Scagliola and Paul Scagliola; sisters, Shirley Murr and her husband Edward; Joan Dyson and Nancy Cook; and several nieces and nephews. Donald enjoyed and was loved by his grandchildren, especially Melissa, Meghan, Jackson and Taylor, who affectionately called him pop-pop.
