A graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1941, Doris was employed as a Medical Secretary for Dr. Robert Sultar for 10 years, until her retirement in 1985. She was an avid bowler and a former member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in New Britain.

“ I am not sure if Ms. Litke's family will remember me. My name is Rick Daddario and my family lived 6 units away from the Litke's in Pinnacle Heights housing project New Britain back in the very early 1960's. My family moved from the projects to a private home about 2 miles up Slater Road towards Farmington in June 1963. Before that time, my brother David and I were chums with Bill and Donald Litke. We all hung around with Eric and Curt Radda, and Lucia Osiecki. Lynn Radda, approx 7 years old at the time died. It was a devastating moment for all of us because we did not know death. We were unable to understand at our early age I was 4 HOW someone could be playing with us one day, and then a few days later, be gone. I remember two things specifically about life with Mrs. Litke. I remember when I found out that Lynn had passed on I overheard Ethel Osiecki, Lucia's mother telling Jane Turski, another neighbor, that Lynn had passed. I was a little in shock and ran to the Litke's home I believe it was 5 Summit Road and told Mrs. Litke. She said to me, "Ricky, you can't go around saying things like that. I remember I started to cry and ran home. A whole 25 yards. Another time when I was playing outside with Donald, Mrs. Litke called from the house "Dinner time!!" and I shouted back, "Awwwww, SHadddup!" Well - you would think I committed the worst crime ever, but I was merely mimicking not sure of spelling a line Bugs Bunny yelled out to Daffy Duck in a cartoon I saw. If anybody reading this remembers that cartoon - please call my mother - 860-229-8995, and tell her. To this day she maintains I was very rude. But I didnt know.

Anyway - I am genuinely sorry to have heard of Mrs. Litke's passing. I remember reading of her son's some time ago.
