Dorothy Goodrich Lindroth, 85, of Newington, passed away Saturday December 29, 2007 at the Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. She was the widow of Norman E. Lindroth, who died in 2002. A New Britain native, she lived in Newington since 1946. Dorothy graduated from New Britain High School, Class of 1941 and was employed in the accounting department at Newington Children's Hospital for 15 years, retiring in 1988.
