



## Earl U. Brown

December 4, 1928 - February 3, 2012

Earl U. Brown, 83, of Southington, husband of Winifred "Winnie" Bentley Brown, passed away Thursday February 2, 2012 at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. Born in New Britain, son of the late Earl H. and Mary Urban Brown, he lived in Newington and Berlin, moving to Southington in 1966. Earl attended Newington High School and was a US Army Veteran of the Korean Conflict. He worked at Fuller Brush, Berlin Steel and then the former Goss & DeLeeuw in Kensington for 40 years, retiring in 1995. Earl later worked for the Carlson Funeral Home for 15 years. Earl was a member, former Trustee and Usher at Kensington United Methodist Church; he was a fifty year member of Sequin # 140 AF&AM in Newington; and was a member of the Berlin VFW Post.

Besides his wife Winnie, he is survived by a daughter, Sandy "Sam" Brown of Plantsville; a sister, Norma Northam of Memphis, TN; two aunts, Shirley Recck of Berlin and Helen O'Connell of Kensington; a sister-in-law, Barbara Akehurst and her husband Dale of Kensington; several nieces and nephews.
