Earl L. Kumm, 93 husband of the late Marvis (Londin) Kumm, went home to be with his Lord Thursday April 18, 2024 at the Bradley Home in Meriden, CT. Born in New Britain, CT son of the late Clarence and Agnes (Hart) Kumm, he was a former Bristol resident, moving to Meriden over 50 years ago. Earl married Marvis on August 29, 1953 at the Stanley Memorial Church in New Britain. He was baptized with his wife Marvis on June 17, 1964 at Grace Baptist Church in Bristol, CT. Earl received his Bachelor's degree in Science from Teacher's College of Connecticut (now Central Connecticut State University) in 1955. He later received his secondary teaching certificate in English, History and Social Studies, with a Minor in Mathematics. He taught for eight years, mostly in Bristol Public Schools. He served in the US Army and Army Reserves from 1955 to 1963. Earl left teaching in February 1965 to work at Guida's Dairy in New Britain for many years, as an office manager. He was a member of the Meriden Hills Baptist Church.

Surviving are two sons, Timothy Kumm of New Britain and Geoffrey Kumm and his wife Cynthia of Winslow, ME; a daughter, Deborah Lestik of Chesapeake, VA; eight grandchildren; seven great grandchildren; several nieces and nephews. Besides his wife Marvis and parents, Earl was predeceased by four brothers, Roy, Russell, Wesley and George Kumm, as well as a sister, Shirley Glynn.
