Earl C. Root, Jr., 67, of Newington, died Thursday September 8, 2005 at the West Haven VA Medical Center. A native and former New Britain resident, he lived in Newington since 1969. He attended E.C. Goodwin Technical School and earned an apprenticeship certificate as a machinist from the State of Connecticut. Earl was a U.S. Army veteran during the Vietnam Conflict. He was a member and former Elder of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church and was a member of the Bristol Fish & Game Club.
