Edna Larson Carroll was born in New Britain on June 14, 1909, daughter of the late John A. and Jennie Johnson Larson. A life long resident of New Britain she attended local schools and graduated from New Britain Normal School in 1929. She taught in New Britain and Berlin retiring in 1973.

She was an active member of First Lutheran Church of the Reformation where she served on the Altar Guild for many years and was a member of the Priscilla Circle. Edna was also a long time member of the New Britain Womans' Club. She was predeceased by her husband of 67 years, Ellsworth H. Carroll, who died in 2005.

She is survived by three daughters, Betsy and her husband Alan Dickinson of Wilbraham, MA; Susan and her husband Robert Garlick of Topinabee, Michigan; and Virginia and her husband Roger Moore of Hamilton Township, New Jersey.
