



Edna Swain Wenner

January 23, 1911 - June 7, 2003

Edna Swain Wenner, 92, formerly of New Britain and most recently of Essex, CT, died peacefully at Essex Meadows Health Center on Saturday, June 7, 2003. She was the widow of the late L. John Wenner, retired professor and artist at Central Connecticut State University, who died in 1992. Born in Hammonton, NJ, she lived most of her life in New Britain and was a professor in charge of teacher training at CCSU. Mrs. Wenner earned a Bachelor of Science Degree from West Chester State Teachers College in Pennsylvania, a Master of Arts Degree and a Sixth Year Diploma in Professional Education from the University of Connecticut. She held memberships in the American Association of University Professors, the New England Reading Association, and the Connecticut Education Association. In addition to her professional endeavors, Mrs. Wenner excelled in music including playing the piano, organ and voice.

She is survived by her husband's nieces, Carol Snyder and Gay Krause of Bethlehem, PA; a nephew, John Wenner of Allentown, PA; longtime friends, Mr. and Mrs. Neil MacDonald of North Carolina and longtime friends and caregivers, Drs. George and Carol Lippia-Tenney of Essex.

Funeral services will be Tuesday 2:30 PM at the First Church of Christ Congregational of Farmington. Calling hours are Tuesday 1 to 2 PM at the Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain.
