Edward F. Grickis, 81, of Kensington, passed away Monday (January 29, 2024) at his home. Born in Waterbury, son of the late John and Margaret (Dillon) Grickis, he was a graduate of Naugatuck High School, class of 1960. Ed served with the US Navy during the Vietnam War and lived in Kensington since 1963. He was a custodian at First Church of Christ, Congregational in New Britain for twenty years, retiring in 2017.
