Edward Odishoo, 91, of Kensington and Charlestown, RI, widower of Dorothy Rondini Odishoo, passed away Saturday November 16, 2013 at CT Hospice in Branford. A New Britain native, he lived in Kensington since 1963. Ed was a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1940, served with the US Army Air Corps during World War II, and received his Bachelor's Degree from the University of Connecticut in 1950. He was employed in the Industrial Hardware Division of Stanley Works for 30 years, retiring in 1983. Ed was a parishioner of St. Paul's Church, Kensington; was a longtime member of the Health Club at the New Britain YMCA; and was a member of the QEBA Home Owners Association of Charlestown, RI. An avid fisherman and squash player, he loved playing cards with his friends at the YMCA Health Club. He also loved spending time at his beach home in Charlestown, RI.

Surviving is his son, Edward G. Odishoo of Kensington and a niece, Rita Veneziano of Italy. Besides his wife Dorothy, Ed was predeceased by two sisters, Agnes Odishoo and Helen Veneziano; a brother, George Odishoo; and a nephew, Tony Veneziano.
