Elaine M. Aresco, 48, of Kensington, died Friday January 21, 2005 at UConn Health Center in Farmington. Born in New Britain, daughter of the late Carl and Josephine Brunetto Aresco, she was a 1975 graduate of Pulaski High School and later from the Paier School of Art in Hamden. Elaine was a graphic designer and lived in California for over 20 years, moving to Kensington in October of 2004.

Surviving are four brothers, Thomas Aresco and his wife Jadzia of Meriden; James Aresco and his wife Debra of Glastonbury; George Aresco and his wife Ann of Kensington; and Dale Brunetto and his wife Patti Talbot of New Britain; several nieces, nephews, grandnieces and grandnephews.
