Elise Glabau King, 90, of Farmington, wife of the late John A. King, passed away Tuesday July 17, 2012 at UConn Medical Center in Farmington. A longtime New Britain resident, she moved to Farmington in 2010, and was a graduate of New Britain High School class of 1938. Elise worked for the former LeWitt Jewelers as a bookkeeper and later for Central Connecticut State College now CCSU as a secretary in the English Department for 20 years until her retirement in 1985. She was a member of First Church of Christ, Congregational in New Britain.

Elise leaves behind a son, David King and his wife Lisa of Bristol; a brother, Ernest Glabau and his wife Olga of Newington; a sister Jean Messina of Northford; three granddaughters, Elizabeth King of Danbury, Jaclyn King of New York City and Lindsey King of Bristol; several nieces and nephews.
