Emma Pfeiffer Telke, 91, of Jerome Home, New Britain, formerly of Fernstead Lane, Berlin, passed away Wednesday Feb 11, 2009 at Jerome Home. She was the widow of Herman L. Telke, who died in 1990. Born in New Britain, she lived in Berlin over 50 years, returning to New Britain 2 years ago. Emma was a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1936, and was Secretary of Telke Tool & Die in Berlin for 30 years, retiring in 1982. A lifelong member of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church, she was former Assistant Treasurer of the Church; a Past President of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League and the Ladies Aid Society; she was also a member of the Fellowship Group of the church. Emma was a former volunteer for the New Britain Memorial Hospital and the Berlin Salvation Army Committee.

Surviving are two sons, Bruce J. Telke; Steven Telke and Mary Kazersky, all of Berlin; a daughter, Lynn Telke of Newington; a brother, Leonard Pfeiffer of Kensington; a grandson, Bruce C. Telke and his wife Christal of Berlin; two great grandchildren, Lori Anne and Eddie Telke; several nieces and nephews. Besides her husband Herman, she was predeceased by three brothers, Rudolph, Howard and Arthur Pfeiffer.
