



## Ernest F. Jurgen

September 8, 1918 - November 23, 2003

Ernest F. Jurgen, 85, of Covenant Village, Cromwell, husband of Marie Schneider Jurgen died Sunday November 23, 2003 at New Britain General Hospital. A New Britain native, he lived in Plainville for 15 years, Kensington for 30 years, and moved to Cromwell in 2000. A graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1936, he served with the US Merchant Marine during World War II. Ernie worked at New Britain Machine Company for 13 years and at Goss & DeLeeuw in Kensington for 30 years, retiring in 1980. He was a member of Trinity Covenant Church in Plainville and served on the church's Worship Commission.
