



## Esther Anderson Larson

April 8, 1910 - May 2, 2003

Esther Anderson Larson, 93, of Needham, Mass, formerly of New Britain, died Friday May 2, 2003 at Tippet House Hospice in Needham. She was the widow of Richard A. Larson who died in 1987. A native and longtime New Britain resident, she moved to Needham in 1994. A graduate of New Britain High School, class of 1929, she was employed at Stanley Works for 17 years and later New Britain Machine Company for 8 years, retiring in 1975. Esther was a member of First Lutheran Church in New Britain; Priscilla Unit at the church and was former Treasurer of the Golden Friendship Society.
