Eunice Lund Booth, 91, of Farmington, widow of James W. Booth Jr., died Thursday August 10, 2006 at Avon Health Center. Born in West Hartford, daughter of the late Patrick and Jennie Wikstrom Lund, she lived in New Britain for 55 years, moving to Farmington in 1998. A graduate of Hall High School in West Hartford, she was a nurse at Middlesex Hospital. Eunice was a lifelong member of Stanley Memorial Church, where she also taught Sunday School. She was in the first graduating class of the Middlesex Hospital School of Nursing in 1937, and stayed friends with all of her class.
