Francis "Frank" Harvey, 83, of Sun City Center, FL and New Britain, husband of Patricia "Pat" (Harten) Harvey, passed away unexpectedly Tuesday August 8, 2023 at his home in New Britain. Born in Boston, he was a graduate of St. John's Prep in Danvers, Mass, received his Bachelor's from Boston College and graduated from Boston University Law School in 1967. Frank lived in New Britain since 1979 and maintained his Florida residence since 2015. He was the Director of Real Estate for The Stanley Works for 33 years, retiring in 2013. Active in many civic and nonprofit groups, he was Board Chairman of Neighborhood Housing Services of New Britain; was a Commissioner for the Mattabassett District; served in the Board of the New Britain YMCA and New Britain EMS, among other organizations. He was an outdoor enthusiast and loved hiking, biking, kayaking and golfing.
