Frank E. "Pops" Bengtson, Jr., 81, of New Britain, passed away Sunday (February 26, 2017) at the Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. A lifelong New Britain resident, son of the late Frank E. Bengtson Sr. and Dorothy (Marsh), Frank was employed at Emhart Corp. for 17 years and the Northeast Carbide in Southington for 6 years. He worked as a maintenance man at his condo building for the past 15 years.

Frank received Christ as his LORD and Savior in 1976. He is a member of Central Baptist Church in Southington, where he served as an usher. He was formerly a member of Emmanuel Baptist Church in Newington.
