Frank A. Failla, 86, of New Britain, widower of Jeannette Reney Failla, passed away Tuesday December 8, 2009 at The Hebrew Home & Hospital in West Hartford. A native and lifelong New Britain resident, he served with the 8th Army Air Force in Europe during World War II and was a letter carrier for the New Britain Post Office for 40 years, retiring in 1988. Frank was a member of St. Ann's Church; the New Britain VFW Post 511; the Italian-American War Veterans; the DAV; and the Postal Service Union.

Surviving is his son, Frank E. Failla of New Britain; a son-in-law, Joseph Severino Sr. of Berlin; a brother, Vincent "Jimmy" Failla of New Britain; two grandchildren, Joseph Severino Jr and his wife Jennifer of Middletown; and Karen Severino of Berlin; several nieces and nephews. Besides his wife Jeannette, Frank was predeceased by his daughter, Patricia Severino; two brothers, Joseph S. Failla and Salvatore J. Failla; and a sister, Bessie L. Okulicz.
