February 24, 1922 - July 7, 2003

Frank J. Marturano, Sr., 81, of Kensington, son of the late Sofio and Lucia Mezzio Marturano died Monday July 7, 2003 at New Britain General Hospital with his family at his side. Born in New Britain, he resided in Kensington for the past 57 years. He was a World War II US Army Veteran serving with the 169th Infantry, 43rd Division and was a Purple Heart recipient. Frank retired from New York/New Haven and Hartford Railroad as a foreman in 1980. He was a coach in the Berlin Farm League and Little League, and founded the “mandatory two inning rule”. He was a former cub master for Berlin Cub Scout Pack 24, and was a member of Saint Paul’s Church, Kensington. He loved the ocean, boating and working on family member’s cars. He also loved taking his grandsons fishing and enjoyed having his family over to the house, especially when they came to eat.

Surviving is his wife of 57 years, Mary Duell Marturano; three sons and their wives, Frank and Antoinette Marturano of Meriden; Dennis and Mary Marturano and James and Deborah Marturano, all of Berlin; a daughter, Janice Lund and her fiance John Ferry of Kensington; a brother, Sebastian Marturano and his wife Shirley of New Britain; three sisters, Lucy Thiede of New Britain; Anna Pandolfi of Berlin; and Mary Malone of Middletown; nine grandchildren, Brett, Jodi-Lyn and Timothy Marturano, all of Meriden; Alyssa Marturano of Massachusetts; Jimi Marturano of Meriden; Jason and Thomas Marturano of Berlin; and Jeffrey and Jory Lund, also of Berlin; a great grandson, Jordan Taylor Marturano of Bristol; many nieces and nephews. He

was predeceased by a brother, James Vincent Marturano and a sister, Connie Mezzio.
