



## Frank S. Sledzik

October 18, 1913 - August 14, 2003

Frank S. Sledzik, 89, of Farmington, formerly of New Britain, Husband of Angeline Vanni Sledzik, died Thursday August 14, 2003 at Bristol Hospital. Born in Rocky Hill, he lived in New Britain for over 50 years, moving to Farmington in 1997. A World War II US Army veteran, he worked in the Hardware Division of Stanley works for 30 years, retiring in 1986. Frank was a member of St. Ann's Church, New Britain; was former president of the Stanley Seniors; and was former secretary of the Stanley Works Bowling League.

Over the years, he enjoyed fishing, golf, bowling, and tennis.

Besides his wife of 54 years, Angeline, he leaves two sons, David Sledzik and his wife Susan of Bristol; and Brian Sledzik also of Bristol and his fiancée, Joan Sinisgalli of Hartford; a brother, Atty.
