Fred C. Williams Sr., 79, of Kensington, beloved husband of Anne Kilduff Williams, died Monday February 14, 2005 at UConn Health Center in Farmington. Born in Joliet, IL, he has lived in Kensington since 1948. A World War II, U.S. Navy veteran, Fred served in the U.S. Submarine Service aboard the USS Raton in the Pacific Theatre. He was employed as a mason at Ellsworth Brothers in Kensington for 20 years and later at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft in Southington for another 20 years until his retirement in 1990. Fred was a member of Stanley Memorial Church in New Britain where he served as a Trustee and former Deacon; and a member of the Berlin VFW Post. Besides his beloved wife Anne of 58 years, he is survived by two daughters, Atty.
