



## Frederick "Fred" Elia

May 27, 1930 - December 17, 2014

Frederick "Fred" Elia, 84, of Old Saybrook, passed away Wednesday December 17, 2014 at Aaron Manor Nursing Home in Chester. Born in New Britain, son of the late Yousepos Elia and Hanna Lazar Elia, he was a longtime New Britain resident, moving to Old Saybrook in 1989. A graduate of Cheshire Academy, Fred served with the US Army during the Korean Conflict. He was Corporate Director of Administrative Services for Stanley Works, where he worked for 41 years, retiring in 1997. Fred was a member of South Church in New Britain; Unity Lodge #148 AF&AM and he supported many local community organizations.

Surviving are two brothers, Norman Elia of Old Saybrook and Robert Elia and his wife Nellie of Ozark, AL; a sister, Elizabeth "Betty" Elia of Old Saybrook; three nieces and a nephew.
